

In Australia, 1 in 6 young people have experienced homelessness before. We'd love for you to start conversations with students around this statistic, start talking about homelessness, and learn about the power of conversation.

It's simple, take part in #classroomsconversations and share imagery around how you are representing the 1 in 6 young people experiencing homelessness.

We encourage teachers and students to get creative and think outside the box on how they can run this activity. However, here are some ideas to get you started:

USING OUR CLASSROOM CONVERSATION STARTERS:

<u>Option 1</u> - place 6 conversation starter cards on 6 students chairs. Ask those 6 students to come to the front of the

classroom and read out each card. Have the remaining students respond and begin sparking conversations around homelessness.

<u>Option 2</u> - remove every 1 in 6 chairs in a classroom and replace the chair with a conversation starter. Ask those standing students to read out the conversation starter and have other students respond.

<u>Option 3</u> - at an all-student assembly have 1 in every 6 students stand up. Share the statistic with them and break out into groups to start conversations around homelessness. (e.g 300 students, 1 in 6 = 50 students)

<u>Option 4</u> - come up with your own representation of 1 in 6 and ask students to run an activity and start conversation around homelessness.
